Assistant professors with teaching appointments should ideally have at least three observations before promotion and tenure, with one of them occurring before reappointment. The Reviewer should conduct each of the reviews in a separate academic year. The observation and evaluation period for Associate Professors should be aligned with a post-tenure review with a minimum of two observations before promotion to full Professor. These guidelines describe general expectations with respect to the three major areas into which faculty activities in the School of Design (SoD) are likely to fall: teaching and other educational activities; research activities, scholarly activities, artistic activities, and/or professional practice; and other considerations (service). An academic major is the academic discipline to which an undergraduate student formally commits.
