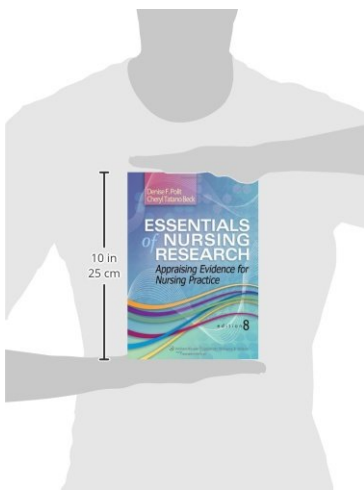

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Critically appraising the evidence. The search terms used were: evidence-based practice, research evidence, evidence for practice, qualitative research, reflective practice, reflection and evidence. Other sources included handpicking of books on evidence-based practice, reflection and research. Only material written in English was included. Evidence-based practice is necessary for nursing, but its effective implementation may be hindered by the hierarchy of evidence.
