The term "developmental disabilities" is a broader category of often lifelong challenges that can be intellectual, physical, or both.² "IDD" is the term often used to describe situations in which intellectual disability and other disabilities are present.³ It might be helpful to think about IDDs in terms of the body parts or systems they affect or how they occur. For example⁴ Degenerative Individuals with degenerative disorders may seem or be typical at birth and may meet usually developmental milestones for a time, but then they experience disruptions in skills, abilities, and functions because of the condition. In some cases, the disorder may not be detected until the child is an adolescent or adult and starts to show symptoms or lose abilities. He was a minister in the United Methodist Church. He is perhaps best known for his developmental model based on faith, which he wrote about in his book *Stages of Faith: The Psychology of Human Development and the Quest for Meaning*. According to Fowler, there are seven primary stages of faith (including Stage 0) in the life of the individual. They are as follows
