Newspaper film reviews, because of their high circulation numbers and wide readership, are key elements in the presentation of film. These texts are related to the film industry, to film criticism and to journalism. They are located at a nexus of discourses and are potential. Instead, I found a significant difference between the kind of review that aims to explore and interpret a film, and the kind of review that aims chiefly to classify and label it. To some extent the first kind of review is related to art criticism, while the second has to do with consumer guidance. Ultimately, however, the labels of "art" and "commerce" seemed too simple for the task at hand. A film reviewer may choose the critical-educational approach, and aim to enhance his readers' understanding of each artwork he reviews. Content Review. When you are about to read a new book or go to the movies, how do you know that there are films and books the time spent on them? Of course, from the Review! In the narrow sense of the word "Review" a review, your personal assessment of what you have seen, read or visited. We will not shelve and immediately turn to the example of Review of the film, which I love very much, "The Hunger Games" ("The Hunger Games"). To do the theory portion of your lit review, you have to read all the theory sections of the papers you have found.
